


Origins of the BDA Audit

A brief history









Origins of the BDA Audit

- 1992 BDA Accreditation
- In 2000, Vocational Qualifications (VQs) are introduced as the minimum standard of demonstrating adequate training.
- 2006 BDA Audit introduced in readiness for CDM, 2007
- Demonstration of compliance with BS 22475 Parts 2 and 3, the Yellow Book (Second Edition) and CDM, 2015.
- Ongoing competence post-VQs.






Why should you be Audited?

Health and Safety




 The BDA Audit checks that your company's health and safety procedures are robust and accurate.



Ongoing Competence










• The BDA Audit provides evidence of on-going, continuous competence of on-site staff.





What is covered?





Things checked during a BDA Audit

- Industry qualifications
- Health and safety certification
- Adherence to relevant legislation and guidance
- On-site health, safety and environment issues

- Drilling operations
- Drilling machine compliance
- Drilling machine safety
- Training & CPD
- Good communication and working practices
- General good practice

This is not an exhaustive list, just a general overview





- BDA Audit conforms to ISO 19011
- Improved consistency.
- Evidence gathering exercise.
- Audit Reports include:
 - Factual evidence on any Non-conformities (graded depending on the context of the risks)
 - Observations and recommendations for improvements
 - Notes on good practice



Definitions

OBSERVATION

NON-CONFORMITY

MAJOR NON-CONFORMITY





OBSERVATION

• DEFINED AS: Good practice, an opportunity for improvement or recommendations.



NON-CONFORMITY

• DEFINED AS: A deviation from current standards which if left unrectified could lead to a hazard to the health or safety of personnel or the environment or to a sub-standard quality of work.

• All non-conformities must be rectified and closed out before audited status is granted.




MAJOR NON-CONFORMITY

• DEFINED AS: A deviation from the current standards which presents an immediate hazard to the health or safety of personnel or the environment, a potential breach of legal duty and where rectification cannot be immediately achieved.

A single major non-conformity = termination of audit





Full Audit Report

Will be issued to Auditee and Employer following the Quality Assurance from the BDA Audit Manager.

MAJOR NON-CONFORMITY NOTED IN RED



Assigning Audit

Confirm Auditee location.

Closest Auditor will be assigned.

• Different Auditor every year where possible.



BDA Audit Management

- Administration of Audit:
 - Collection of documentation
 - Invoicing
 - Assigning audit
- Quality Assurance




Quality Assurance

- Consistency in Audits.
- Assurance of evidence and outcomes.
- Aiming for third-party endorsement.



BDA Audit Process

How is the Audit carried out and results given?






Pre-Audit Requirements

- 1. Completed application form
- Copy of VQ certificate (Front AND Back – VQ endorsement must be correct for discipline being audited)
- 3. Copy CSCS card (Front AND Back)
- 4. Current First Aid qualification
- 5. Payment in full of the Audit fee



Audit Process





BDA Audit Card





- Free, digital e-card.
- Direct communication with auditees.




Appeals Process

- Discuss with BDA Auditor
- Appeals within 7 days.
- The Appeals Panel includes:
 - BDA Audit Manager
 - Chair of the BDA
 - Chair of the BDA Safety Committee
 - Chair of the BDA Technical Committee
 - A non-involved BDA Auditor
- Decision within 28 days.



FAQs

Frequently Asked Questions





Cost of Audit

£390 + VAT per Audit for BDA Members

£750 + VAT per Audit for non-BDA Members

If a crew is audited together, the Support Operative is free.



Other Types of Audit

Broaden scope to Waterwall, Geothermal, etc.




Subcontractors
